American Nurses Association (ANA) represents the **professional nurses** (united states) 1995

Evolution of the nursing profession:

- Nursing practices requires a combination of:
- → Intellectual achievement.
- Ethical standards.
- Scientific Skills.
- Personal compassion
- ◆ Nursing profession affected as a results of evolution someelements.

Professionalism: Is a behavior that upholds the status methods, character, and standards of given profession.

- Criteria which recognized nursing as a profession
- → American nurses association standards of clinical nursing practices

A- Standards of care:

- ◆ Standards 1: <u>Assessment</u> The nurse collect patients health data.
 - ◆ Standards 2: <u>Diagnosis</u>: the nurse analyzes the assessment data in determining diagnosis.
- ◆ Standards 3: <u>Outcome identification:</u> the nurse identifies expected outcome Individualized to the pt.
- ◆ Standards 4: Planning: The nurse develops a plan of care that prescribe intervention to attain expected outcomes
- ♦ Standards 5: Implementation: the nurse implements the intervention identified in the Plan of care.
- ◆ Standards 6: <u>Evaluation</u>: the nurse evaluates the pts. Progress toward attainment of outcomes.

B- Standards of professional performance

Standards 1: Quality of care: the nurse systematically evaluates the quality and

effectiveness of nursing practice.

Standards 2: **performance appraisal:** the nurse evaluate one s own nursing practice in

relation to professional practice standards and relevant statutes and regulation.

Standards 3: **Education:** acquires and maintains current knowledge and competency in nursing practice.

Standards 4: <u>Collegiality:</u>الزمالة the nurse interacts with and contributes to the professional development of peers and other health care providers as colleagues

Standards 5: **Ethics:** the Nurse's decision and action on behalf of pts. Aredetermined in an ethical manner.
